Confessional Readings

Excerpts from the Accra Confession (paragraphs/articles 26, 37):

Leader: We believe that God calls us to stand with those who are victims of injustice.

We know what the Lord requires of us: to do justice, love kindness, and walk in God's way (Mic 6.8). We are called to stand against any form of injustice in the economy and the destruction of the environment, "so that justice may roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream" (Am 5.24).

All: By confessing our faith together, we covenant in obedience to God's will as an act of faithfulness in mutual solidarity and in accountable relationships. This binds us together to work for justice in the economy and the earth both in our common global context as well as our various regional and local settings.



Song or Hymn of Response

Celebration of Communion

Leader: Lift up your hearts!

All: We lift them up to the Lord!



Leader: With joy we praise you, gracious God, for you created heaven and earth, made us in your image, and kept covenant with us—even when we fell into sin. We give you thanks for Jesus Christ, our Lord, who by his life, death and resurrection opened to us the way of everlasting life. On this Reformation Sunday, we praise you for living in us now by your Spirit, and we pray that this bread and cup may be for us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

All: May we and all your saints be united with Christ and remain faithful in hope and love.

Leader: Come, now, for all is ready! The gifts of God for the people of God.

The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said,

"This is my body, which is for you;

do this in remembrance of me."

After supper, he took the cup, and gave thanks and gave to them, saying,

"Drink of it, all of you.

This is my blood of the new covenant,

which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins."

Take, eat, and drink, remember, and believe that the precious body and blood of our Lord was given for the complete forgiveness of all our sins.

We pray for those who defend nature, those who work for reconciliation, those who break down barriers, those who fight for equality, those who make peace.
